

## Amphenol Trackwise Conflict Minerals Declaration

The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 and the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) now require public companies to report on the origin of minerals commonly used in the electronics industry, specifically Tin (Sn), Tantalum (Ta), Tungsten (W) and Gold (Au).

These minerals are defined as Conflict Minerals because they are found in regions where forced labour and other human rights abuses are used to mine these minerals and finance armed conflict, specifically in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and its adjoining countries.


The purpose of the legislation is to motivate manufacturers to ensure that these minerals come from conflict-free sources and to prevent armed groups from benefiting from the use of force and human rights abuses.

Amphenol Trackwise is committed to sourcing responsibly and considers mining activities that fuel conflict as unacceptable. To the best of our knowledge, none of our products contain Tantalum or Tungsten but may contain Tin or Gold, where specified by our customers.

Due to the length and complexity of the Tin and Gold supply chains, Amphenol Trackwise cannot verify the mining origin of all Tin and Gold used in its products. We expect our suppliers to:

- Comply with the Conflict Minerals Regulations
- Inform us immediately if the products supplied to us contain Conflict Minerals
- Cascade these requirements down their supply chain

Based on the information from our suppliers, and to the best of our knowledge, none of our products contain Conflict Minerals.
